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Alternative Dispute Resolution Updates

Preliminary

As of 31 January 2021

This ADR Update records in brief the collective accomplishments of NCMB as of January 2021.

I. PREVENTIVE MEDIATION (PM)

- 35 cases pending at the beginning of the year
- 40 new cases have been filed in January
- 75 total cases handled as of 31 January 2021
- Disposition rate: 23% (17 of the 75 total cases handled)
 - 16 cases disposed within the process cycle time (PCT = 35 days)
 - o 1 case disposed beyond PCT
- Settlement rate: 21% (16 of the 75 total cases handled)
- · Average duration to settle: 22 days
- 58 cases pending as of 31 January 2021
 - 36 pending cases are 35 days old or younger
 - 22 pending cases are older than the PCT
- Monetary benefits: Php2,440,948 benefitting 236 workers

II. NOTICES OF STRIKE/LOCKOUT (NS/L)

- 25 cases pending at the beginning of the year
- 14 new cases have been filed in January
- 39 total cases handled as of 31 January 2021
- Disposition rate: 10% (4 of the 39 total cases handled)
 - 4 cases were disposed within the process cycle time (PCT = 60 days)
- Settlement rate: 10% (4 of the 39 total cases handled)
- Average duration to settle: 29 days
- 35 cases pending as of 31 January 2021
 - 19 pending cases are 60 days old or younger
 - 16 pending cases are older than the PCT
- Monetary benefits: Php34,879,876 benefitting 434 workers
- Mandays saved: 646,966 *

*computed as average strike duration for the last five years multiplied by the number of workers involved in NS/L handled during the reporting period.

III. ACTUAL STRIKES/LOCKOUTS (AS/L)

- Only one (1) case pending at the beginning of the year
- No work stoppages have been monitored in January 2021

VI. SINGLE ENTRY APPROACH (SEnA)

- 167 Requests for assistance (RFAs) pending at the beginning of the year
- 521 new RFAs have been filed in January
- 688 total RFAs handled as of 31 January 2021
- Disposition rate: 48% or 332 of the 688 total RFAs handled
 - o 328 RFAs disposed within the process cycle time (PCT = 30+15 days)
 - 4 RFAs disposed beyond the PCT
- Settlement rate: 29% (201 of the 688 total RFAs handled)
 - of 199 RFAs settled within the process cycle time (PCT = 30 days +15 days)
 - o 2 RFAs settled beyond the process cycle time
- Average duration to settle: 9 days
- 356 pending RFAs as of 31 January 2021
 - o 335 RFAs pending within the process cycle time (PCT = 30 days)
 - o 21 RFAs pending beyond the process cycle time
- Monetary benefits: Php4,919,512 benefitting 207 workers

VII. VOLUNTARY ARBITRATION (VA)

- 480 cases pending at the beginning of the year
- 58 new VA cases have been submitted in January
- 538 cases handled as of 31 January 2021
- 60 cases disposed
- 11% disposition rate (60 of the 538 total cases handled)
 - 42 cases disposed within the process cycle time (PCT = 90 days)
 - 18 cases disposed beyond PCT
- Average duration to Decide:
 - o 667 days from the date of acceptance by the arbitrator
 - o 26 days from submission for resolution
- 478 cases pending as of 31 January 2021
- Monetary benefits: Php147,241,211 benefitting 61 workers

VIII. WORKPLACE RELATIONS ENHANCEMENT

- 12 LMCs have been facilitated in January 2021, all of which were unorganized companies)
- 46 LMCs enhanced (14 in organized companies and 32 in unorganized companies)
- 175 companies reached through promotional/pre-facilitation activities as of January 2021 (20 in organized companies and 155 in unorganized companies)
- 4,312 existing LMCs nationwide as of 31 January 2021 (1,584 in organized companies; 2,728 in unorganized establishments)
- 99.5% or 4,013 out of 4,033 companies with LMCs were not involved in AS/L, NS/L, PM cases during the period

IX. CONVERGENCE PROGRAM WITH DOLE

- LMCs Enhanced through convergence programs as of January 2021:
 - 6 LMCs enhanced through convergence program with NWPC (productivity)
 - o 7 LMC in OSHC and ECC on occupational safety and health

X. GRIEVANCE MACHINERY (GM)

- 12 GMs operationalized / institutionalized in the month of January 2021 (1 in organized and 11 in unorganized)
- 44 GMs enhanced (12 in organized and 32 in unorganized establishments)
- 4,471 existing/active GMs nationwide as of 31 January 2021 (1,911 in organized establishments; 2,560 in unorganized establishments)
- 99.46% or 4,090 out of 4,112 companies with GMs were not involved in AS/L, NS/L, PM cases during the period
