Alternative Dispute Resolution **Updates**

Preliminary

As of December 31, 2014

This ADR update records in brief the collective accomplishment of NCMB from January 1 to December 31, 2014.

ACTUAL STRIKES/LOCKOUTS (AS/L) 1.

- Two (2) work stoppages were declared in 2014.
 - o Radio Mindanao Network (RCMB XI) declared on October 2, 2014, on grounds of unfair labor practice with 19 workers affected. The case was amicably settled last December 13, 2014.
 - o Cenapro Chemicals Corporation (RCMB VII) with 32 workers affected, declared on October 18, 2014 on grounds of unfair labor practice. The case was amicably settled last December 8, 2014.
- 1,260 Total man-days lost

NOTICES OF STRIKE/LOCKOUT (NS/L) 11.

- 32 cases pending at the beginning of the year 159 new cases filed from January to December 2014 191 total cases handled during the period
- Disposition rate: 83% (159 of the 191 cases handled)
 - 107 cases disposed within the process cycle time (PCT = 45 days)
 - o 52 cases disposed beyond the process cycle time (average of 74 days in excess of PCT)
- Settlement rate: 82% (156 of the 191 cases handled)
- Average duration to settle: 53 days
- 32 cases pending as of December 31, 2014
 - o 16 pending cases are 45 days old or younger
 - o 16 pending cases are older than the PCT by an average of 285 days
 - Average days pending: 178 days
- Monetary benefits: Php2.35-B benefitting 13,600 workers
