This ADR update records in brief the collective accomplishments of NCMB during the month of December 2018.

#### I. PREVENTIVE MEDIATION (PM)

- 33 cases pending at the beginning of the year
   466 new cases filed since January (17 cases filed in December)
   499 total cases handled as of December 31, 2018
- Disposition rate: 94% (467 of the 499 total cases handled)
  - o 347 cases disposed within the process cycle time (PCT = 60 days)
  - o 120 cases disposed beyond PCT
- Settlement rate: 90% (448 of the 499 total cases handled)
- Average duration to settle: 31 days
- 32 cases pending as of December 31, 2018
  - o 16 pending cases are 35 days old or younger
  - 16 pending cases are older than the PCT
- Monetary benefits: Php148,723,455 benefitting 3,043 workers
