# Alternative Dispute Resolution

## **Updates**

Preliminary

As of September 30, 2014

This ADR update records in brief the collective accomplishment of NCMB from January to September 30, 2014, with particular emphasis on the current month.

## I. ACTUAL STRIKES/LOCKOUTS (AS/L)

No work stoppage monitored from January to September 2014.

### II. NOTICES OF STRIKE/LOCKOUT (NS/L)

- 32 cases pending at the beginning of the year
   130 new cases filed from January to September (14 cases filed in September alone)
  - 162 total cases handled during the period
- Disposition rate: 72% (117 of the 162 cases handled)
  - 87 cases disposed within the process cycle time (PCT = 45 days)
  - 30 cases disposed beyond the process cycle time (average of 80 days in excess of PCT)
- Settlement rate: 72% (116 of the 162 cases handled)
- Average duration to settle: 47 days
- 45 cases pending as September 30, 2014
  - o 22 pending cases are 45 days old or younger
  - o 23 pending cases are older than the PCT by an average of 202 days
  - Average days pending: 138 days
- Monetary benefits: Php1.64-B benefitting 8,314 workers
- Mandays saved: 346, 270\*
  - \*computed as average strike duration for last five years x workers involved in NS/L during the reporting period.

  - 111 cases disposed beyond the process cycle time (average of 34 days in excess of PCT)

- Settlement rate: 79% (314 of the 395 cases handled)
